Judi Gor is a light artist living in the Netherlands. In cooperation with the architects Ton Alberts and Joost van Santen she designed a chain of sunlight reflecting objects for the head office of the ING Bank in Amsterdam. Between 1987 and 1992, she founded the "Light" Foundation whose goal was to design light events in urban surroundings. With the "Light" Foundation, she carried out several events, such as; the opening of the theatre festival" Theatre on the Werf in Utrecht, the Neon installation for the Architecture Fair in Utrecht, a presentation for Queen Beatrix at the "Riddenzaal", The Hague; Opening of the opera season "Change of Atmosphere" for the Music Theatre of Amsterdam. In cooperation with the Japanese choreograph Suzaku Takauchi, she realised a performance using lighted cranes surrounding the Maritime Museum at the eastern harbour of Amsterdam. With the Royal Architects Haaskoning, she designed a light installation for the recycling centre in Beverwijk, the Netherlands. In this project, hundred meters of coloured light fibers were used. During the years 1993-2002, she designed a light plan for the old harbour of Amsterdam. Her objective was to research ways of integrating light design with urban design. In the United Kingdom, she was invited to design light installations for the Victorian Headland promenade of Hartlepool. Since 2004, she has been guiding students of architecture at the Shenkar Academy of Tel Aviv and the Technion in Haifa, Israel. Together with the students, she developed interactive light designs for the old centres of Acre, Nazareth and Jaffa. Recently she started developing designs for digital communication. The designs aim at the waterfronts of Amsterdam. Design of a chain of shelters called: The Cyber-Spaces incorporates operating systems that links with sensors and LED systems. Light events are activated by the visitors in the shelters. The designs will be exhibited in October 2011 at the new Cultural Centre of North Amsterdam The Tolhuistuin
